OPEN INTERNATIONAL BIDDING

- 1. The State Trading Corporation (STC) is inviting proposal from eligible bidders for the **Provision of Consultancy**Services for Valuation and Due Diligence exercise for acquisition of an existing Bulk Liquefied Petroleum Gas
 (LPG) Terminal Business in Mauritius as per requirements contained in the bidding document.

Technical and Financial proposals must be submitted separately, EITHER in hard-copy in the Tender Box located in the Registry of STC, OR in PDF format via the STC's secured email addresses specified in the bidding document and as per terms and conditions laid down in the said bidding document and must be received at STC by the closing date and time Monday 28 March 2022 up to 14.00 hrs (Mauritian Time) at latest.
- 4. Offers received after the submission deadline and/or submitted to a different physical address or an email address other than the secured email addresses mentioned above, shall not be considered.
- 5. The Technical Offers will be opened at the State Trading Corporation, Head Office, Ebène, Réduit, MAURITIUS on **Monday 28 March 2022 at 14.01 hrs** in the presence of bidders/representatives who may choose to attend.
- 6. Any request for clarification in respect of this bidding exercise shall be submitted on the fax number or email addresses provided in the bidding document, at least seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission.
- 7. The STC reserves the right to accept or reject any Offer, annul the Bidding process and reject all Offers at any time prior to award of the Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to any Bidder.
